Synopsis: Propertius is a poet of the Augustan period, a
successor of the great Hellenistic elegiac poets Callimachus
and Philitas, and a precursor of Ovid.

Secondly, it is true that the text of Propertius has come down to us in a deplorable

codices compound these problems by frequently ending an elegy
where one would least expect it to finish, or presenting an
extended block of verse where clearly several separate poems
once stood.
